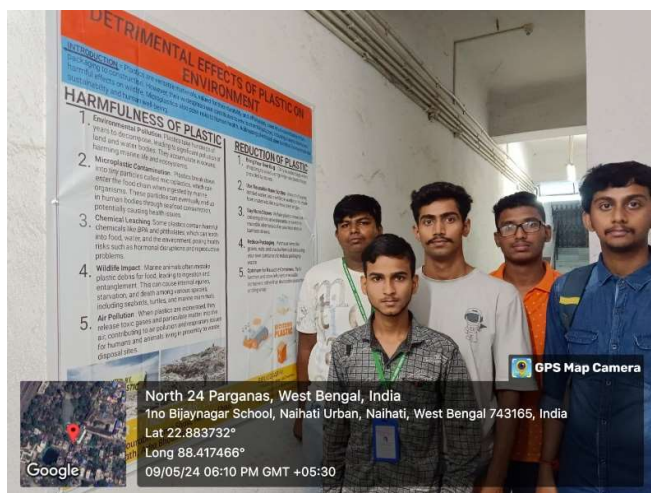

Objective of the Seminar: The main objective of the seminar was to promote awareness about mental health and its impact on daily life and to aware participants about common mental health conditions and importance of open discussions to reduce stigma associated with mental illness. Speaker: Prof. Sulakshana Saha Chakraborty, Department of Philosophy, Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College, Naihati

Report of the Seminar: The speaker provided valuable insights into understanding mental health and mental illness, particularly focusing on the impact of stress, anxiety, and depression on youth. She elaborated on the significance of self-care, adequate sleep, and maintaining a balanced routine in promoting mental well-being. Additionally, she conducted a hands-on session, offering practical training in simple yet effective techniques such as meditation and yoga, which can be easily incorporated into daily life to manage stress and enhance emotional resilience. The event saw active participation from about 35 students, 10 teachers, and staff. An interactive Q&A session was conducted where participants asked questions and shared thoughts openly.

Outcome of the Seminar: The seminar helped dispel common myths about mental health and encouraged a culture of empathy, openness, and support. It emphasized that when students take care of their physical health through proper nutrition, regular exercise, and nurture their mental well-being through stress management, mindfulness, they become better equipped to excel academically and grow personally.
