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RISHI BANKIM CHANDRA EVENING COLLEGE

Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College (RBCEC), Naihati, North 24 Parganas, West Bengal, was established in 1947. Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College got University affiliation after Trifurcation in 1984. Presently affiliated under the West Bengal State University, Barasat. RBCEC is registered under the section 2(f) & 12 (B) of UGC Act, 1956 and Re-Accredited by NAAC (Cycle 2) with Grade 'B' (2016).



RISHI BANKIM CHANDRA EVENING COLLEGE (RBCEC) is a Government-aided institution of graduate and post-graduate studies enjoying accreditation conferred by NAAC. Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College was established in 1947. It was renamed as Evening Section of the erstwhile Rishi Bankim Chandra College, named after the Great Litterateur Rishi Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay. The College was shifted to the present location at Kanthalpara and situated close to his birth place in the next year (June, 1948), when the day section of the college was started. Our college got University affiliation after Trifurcation in 1984. The College caters to the needs of higher education of the districts of North 24 Parganas and adjoining Nadia and Hooghly. As a centre of higher studies, this institution acts both as an upholder of academic values and as a contributor towards social and economic empowerment of the young people in the neighbourhood. By imparting graduate education in Arts, Commerce and Science, the College has proved its enduring concern for society at large over sixty years. The College offers courses like B.A., B.Com., B.Sc. and M.Com. The College now has plans to embark on extension programmes, and so has constructed a new four-storied building to add excellence to the existing machinery.

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The College was originally founded in 1947 by some noted educationists of the neighbourhood. It was housed then in Naihati Mahendra School building and as classes were held in evening hours, had the name Rishi Bankim Chandra College (Evening). In the following years, Day Section and Morning Section of the College were added. Thus, the then Rishi Bankim Chandra College was born and within a very short span of time it drew the acclaim and attention of the public and academics of note. Following in on the trifurcation of the parent body in1984 for administrative purposes, the present Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College emerged as a full-fledged independent unit. In addition to imparting University affiliated courses at graduate level, the College has a plan for introduction of career advancement courses in collaboration with efficient institutes in different disciplines.

THE LOGO

The Logo of the College has the year 1947 in it to indicate the year of foundation in which the undivided college was started in the evening time. Later in 1984 it came to be known as Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College.

The seven-leaf Deodar bough in the Logo symbolizes the '**Saptaparni**' traditionally offered to successful students with the conferring of degree by traditional Indian Viswa-Vidyalaya.

COURSES OF STUDY OFFERED

4-YEAR (HONOURS / HONOURS WITH RESEARCH) OR 3-YEAR MULTIDISCIPLINARY PROGRAMMES UNDERGRADUATE (UG) DEGREE COURSES

A. Single Major Programmes

- a) 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours) with Major in the field of Arts / Science / Commerce / Management (8 semesters with min. 180 Credits) (See Table 1).
- b) 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) with Major in the field of Arts / Science / Commerce / Management (8 semesters with min. 180 Credits). Students need to complete a research project of 15 credits in areas of their Major discipline in the 4th year of studies. (See Table 2)

B. Multidisciplinary Programmes

c) 3-year Bachelor's degree with Multidisciplinary programme of studies in Physical sciences / Mathematical & Computer sciences/ Social sciences / Humanities / Commerce & Management (6 semesters with minimum 125 credits. (See Table 3)

1. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

A candidate taking up Honours in a subject must have obtained:

• A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

OR

55% marks in the subject or related subject in the previous qualifying examination

OR

50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied

• Candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled tribe category must have obtained 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the subject/related subjects at the previous qualifying examination (10+2 level) for being eligible for admission in the Honours programme of study.

2. CHOICE OF COURSES

a) 4-year UG (Honours/Honours with Research) Course of Studies:

Candidates will have to choose a **single major discipline** and **any two minor disciplines** along with the requisite numbers of **AEC**, **SEC**, **MDC & VAC** along with **internship** as shown in Table 1 & 2.

[**Nomenclature of degree will be notified later on communication from UGC.]

b) 3-Year Multidisciplinary Undergraduate (UG) programme of study:

A candidate is required to choose **any three subjects** from **one** or **two broad** category of disciplines as given below. He/she will be awarded a 3-year B.A. / B.Sc. / B. Com. in a particular discipline provided that **at least two** out of the three subjects chosen by him/her falls in that particular category.

3. BROAD CATEGORY OF DISCIPLINES

The disciplines offered by our college are as follows,

- (i) **Physical Sciences:** Chemistry, Physics.
- (ii) Life Sciences: N.A.
- (iii) Mathematical and Computer Sciences: Mathematics.
- (iv) Humanities: Film Studies, Philosophy, Journalism & Mass Communication, English, Bengali, Hindi, Sanskrit.
- (v) Social Sciences: Political Science, History, Economics, Education, Geography.
- (vi) Commerce & Management: Financial Accounting, Cost Accounting, Principle & Practice Management and all other allied subjects.

Groups of Subjects:

Gr. I: Physics, Education, Film Studies.

- Gr. II: Mathematics, History.
- Gr. III: Chemistry, Sanskrit.
- Gr. IV: Economics.

Gr. V: Political Science.

Gr.VI: Geography, Philosophy, Journalism & Mass Communication

Gr. VII: English

Gr. VIII: Bengali, Hindi

Gr. IX: Commerce and allied subjects

Gr. X: Management and allied subjects with related specializations like Finance, Marketing, Human Resource Management, Systems and Operations.

Note:

- (A) For the 4-year UG Programme with Honours, a candidate is required to choose his/her Major in a discipline and two other disciplines for Minor courses, from among Group-I to Group-VIII as above by taking not more than one discipline from any of the groups mentioned above.
- (B) For the 3-year Multidisciplinary Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose any three Core subjects from among the broad category of disciplines (list 6) as offered by the concerned college. However, the choice of the three subjects will have to be made as stated hereunder:

• For B. Sc. 3-year Multidisciplinary Programme, a candidate is required to choose three Core subjects from among Group I to VIII by taking not more than one subject from the same group and at least two science subjects.

• For the B. A. 3-year Multidisciplinary Course of Studies, a candidate is required to choose three Core subjects from among Group I to VIII by taking not more than one subject from the same group and at least two subjects from Humanities and Social Sciences.

• For B. Com 3-year Multidisciplinary programme three core subjects to be chosen from Commerce and allied discipline maintaining NEP norm.

5. CURRICULAR COMPONENTS OF THE UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME

• MAJOR AND MINOR DISCIPLINES

Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline.

Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of [18] credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded B.A. degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics.

In addition to major and minor disciplines, a student admitted in the 4-year Undergraduate programme (Hons. / Hons. with research) has to take the following courses as shown in Table 1 & Table 2.

• MULTIDISCIPLINARY COURSE (MDC):

All UG students are required to undergo 3 introductory-level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines given below. These courses are intended to broaden the intellectual experience and form part of liberal arts and science education. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class) in the proposed major and minor stream under this category.

Students will be asked to choose 3 different MDCs for 3 semesters. The MDC disciplines offered by our college are as follows,

• ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSE (AEC):

Students are required to achieve competency in a **Modern Indian language** or in the **English language** with special emphasis on language and communication skills. These courses aim at enabling the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistics skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills, that help students articulate their arguments and present their thinking clearly and coherently.

• SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSE (SEC):

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on-training, soft skills to enhance the employability of the students.

Each of the AEC and SEC courses shall carry 3 credits.

Students are required to choose three SEC courses from a pool of courses in their 4th, 5th and 6th semester of study.

In AEC, they have to study three courses (each of 3 credits) of either English or Modern Indian language (MIL) in their 1st, 2nd and 3rd semesters of study.

• VALUE ADDITION COURSES (VAC):

These are courses that will help develop all capacities of human beings – intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner. Each of these courses carries **3 credits**. The VAC offered by our college is given as mentioned hereunder.

(a) Environmental Studies

Students will be required to pursue or study two value-added courses (VAC) each of 3 credits in their 1st and 2nd semester.

• INTERNSHIP:

A course requiring students to participate in a professional activity or work experience, or cooperative educational activity with an entity external to the educational institution, normally under the supervision of an expert of the given external entity. A key aspect of the internship is induction into actual work situations. Internships involve working with local industry, government or private organizations, business organizations, artists, crafts persons, and similar entities to provide opportunities for students to actively engage in on-site experiential learning.

The student has the option to complete a **2-credit summer internship** through **community engagement or NCC** as organized by the college. The student must complete a 2-credit summer internship by his/her 5th semester of study.

• FINAL YEAR RESEARCH PROJECT / DISSERTATION:

A student selected for pursuing 4-year Honours with Research programme is required to complete a research project and submit a dissertation to the University for examination and evaluation in the 8th semester. This research project/dissertation work carries 15 credits.

ADMISSION

The College is open for admission to both male and female students in graduate courses as well as PG Course. Selection for admission is based on school leaving academic records and counselling. The admission process starts immediately after the publication of the results of the H.S. Examination of different recognized Indian Boards or Councils. The admission of migrating students is provisional and is confirmed only after the production of migration certificate. **Concessions for admission to SC/ST/OBC students** are allowable as per university guide lines. For the purpose of admission, candidates have to apply online and there exist a detailed guideline regarding this in the college website: <u>www.rbcec.in.</u>They are required to follow the steps mentioned in the item titled *Admission Procedure* in the website. **Provision for financial assistance to needy students** is made under students' Welfare Fund and Students' Aid Fund only after they have been admitted as bonafide students of this institution.

The University guidelines for attendance in classes, college tests and University Examinations are mandatory for all students. Students are expected to maintain the discipline of the college on and off the college campus and participate in the extra-curricular activities like sports, annual fests and other programmes as organized by the college or its constituent bodies.

COLLEGE TESTS

Regular tests, class tests etc. are held according to university guidelines and usual norms. The results of these tests are considered for determining eligible candidates for University Examinations.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

University examinations are the passport for obtaining the degree certificate. They are held under the supervision of the University semester-wise and the publications of results are communicated through the College Office. The Examinations are mandatory for the continuance of studies in the graduate courses.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

CENTRAL LIBRARY

The College Library of the Rishi Bankim Chandra Evening College named as 'RISHI BANKIM LIBRARY' is now located in 2nd floor of the new building 'B-Block'. The computerized library of the college has a rich collection of books (50,000 approx) titles as on 31.05.2022 and adds nearly 1000 new titles every year. The RBL is computerized (Automated) through the Integrated Library Management software KOHA (Customized) with a database of around 18,000 printed books. Without this there exist special collection on Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay, Rabindranath Tagore, and General Reference Section. Beyond these collections, Central Library has an up to dated strong collection on **Career Guidance**. Library services are provided to students, faculties, co-staffs of the college and other members (outsiders) who satisfy required terms and conditions. Further enrichment is going to be made from time to time.



E-RESOURCES

Our Central Library is a member of **N-LIST** (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) Project of Govt. of India which is executed by the e-ShodhSindhu consortium, INFLIBNET Centre through which the registered members of the library can access and download articles from $6,300^+$ E-Journals, 185000+ titles under E-bray, 10800+ e-books and 6,00,000 e-books through NDL. Without this our library has a large collection of CD / DVD on different subjects which can be accessed by the library users.
