1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the college :

Being an Evening College our institution provides an opportunity of higher education to those students who remain otherwise busy during day time either for job or for undergoing extra-curricular courses.

During the last one year, the college authority paid due attention to the enhancement of infrastructural facility. They encouraged research undertaking on the part of teachers. The girl students were provided all sorts of help at the time of admission and were inspired to complete their courses. For the inculcation of scientific attitude and awareness of human rights, orientation is provided by the faculties to the students alongside the regular courses. The authority made their effort to make the best use of the limited infrastructure. The NCC unit of the college contributed to community services like area-cleaning, maintaining law and order etc.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG) :

The college applied for PG course in Commerce to WBSU, but has not yet received requisite permission.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction :

Some Departments made visual presentations of study matters to the students with the help of computer/Laptops. Besides this, oral tests, group discussions and special test were held.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started :

In the Bengali Honours course syllabi, there are portions related to English and Hindi literature. Hence, faculties from the English and Hindi Departments took classes for Bengali Honours students. Teachers of Economics Dept. took classes for students belonging to the Commerce Dept., since Economics is very much a part of the Commerce syllabus, both of Honours and General. These practices facilitate inter-disciplinary activities.

5. Examination reforms implemented :

Annual Examination for Part I, Part II and Part III is programmed and designed by West Bengal State University. The college allowed its building to be used as Exam. venue for the University examinations. As for internal evaluation, the institution conducts oral tests, written tests, group discussion and practical tests (for Science subjects).

6. Candidates qualified : NET/SLET/GATE etc. :

Students are advised to report to their respective departments about their Post-Graduate activities like appearing in Eligibility tests for jobs or undertaking Research programmes.

A report was made last year that Tushar Samanta, an ex-student of the Economics Department, qualified himself in NET.

17. Details of departments getting assistance/recognition under SAP, COSIST (ASSIST)/DST, FIST, and other programmes :

Dr. Amit Kr. Bhandari of the Economics Department secured a grant of Rs. 4,50,400/- for a Major Project from ICSSR.

18. Community services :

The NCC and NSS units of the college conducted cleaning operation in the adjoining areas of the institution. During festivals, the NCC unit maintained law and order in public places. They also facilitated blood donation camps.

19. Teachers and officers newly recruited :

Twenty guest faculties were provided extension of service, even after the expiry of their tenure, in view of their expertise and experience.

Five casual Gr. D Non-teaching employees were also granted extension on the basis of their work-efficiency even after the expiry of their pre-declared tenure.

21. Improvements in the library services :

- Inputted three thousand books into local library software.

No such course matter has so far been introduced by West Bengal State University.

24. Feedback from stakeholders :

Oral feedback was gathered by the faculties from the students.

25. Unit cost of education :

Unit cost of education : With salary component – Rs. 6,620/-Without salary component – Rs. 1,966/-

26. Computerization of administration and the process of admission and examination result, issue of certificates :

Administration is computerized and the admission process is also dependent on computers. Result and certificates are issued by WBSU, and they are electronically processed, designed and finished.

27. Increase in the infrastructural facilities :

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Building space was increased and the amount spent for it was Rs. 85, 11,932/-. Library facilities improved in view of the purchase of books, journals. Technology up gradation was ensured.

28. Technology up gradation :

For technological up gradation : equipments of value Rs. 2,78,194/- were purchased. Computers were used by teachers to explain study matters to the students, particularly in ICT related subjects.

The college had LAN facility connecting the office, library and Evnet. Teachers engaged in Minor or Major projects had a separate space in the library.

29. Computer and internet access and training to teachers, non-teaching staff and students :

Students of Commerce, Physics and Mathematics are given training in computer as it is a part of their curriculum. Teachers and students have access to computers and internet in library and Evnet (college computer centre).

30. Financial aid to students :

SC / ST students receive Govt. stipend, while poor and meritorious students of general caste receive financial aid from Student Aid Fund and Student Welfare Fund.

31. Activities and support from the Alumni Association :

The Alumni Association held its annual meeting and made constructive suggestion to the college authority in respect of infrastructural development, community service and helping the poor but meritorious students. The monetary donation of the alumni consolidates the college fund.

32. Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association :

Parents of many students visited the faculties and the principal during the year to make their suggestions and queries regarding the teaching learning method and curriculum.

33. Health services :

The Health Centre of the college provided first-aid treatment to the staff and students and also provided medicines for minor illness. For serious ailment patients are advised to go to Naihati State General Hospital or to the chambers of qualified doctors.

34. Performance in sports activities :

The students union organized annual sport in college playground. Many students participated in it either as competitors or as volunteers. The teaching and non-teaching staff took part in it as sports officials to conduct the programme smoothly. Competitors securing 1st, 2nd, and 3rd positions in the sports events were awarded prizes. Besides, in the common rooms of students, there are provision for indoor games like chess, carom etc. Throughout the year, students practice the games of football and cricket in the college playground.

35. Incentives to outstanding sportsperson :

Students occupying 1st, 2nd and 3rd positions in different sports events are awarded prizes by the college authority. Promising sportsmen are advised to train themselves under the supervision of sports experts.

38. Placement services provided to students :

The college does not have a placement cell. However, the faculties guide the students in respect of their career opportunities.

39. Development programmes for non-teaching staff :

At present the UGC or the State Education Department do not conduct any development programme for the colleges' Non-teaching staff, as they do in respect of the teachers (like Refresher Course etc.).

However, the college management often hold meetings with the non-teaching employees, so that their work-efficiency may be improved and the stakeholders may be served in a better way.

40. Good practices of the institution :

a) The college encouraged the faculties to undertake research projects.

b) The authority facilitated the cleaning programme undertaken by the students and staff.

41. Linkages developed with National / International, academic/research bodies :

Linkage developed with UGC that sanctioned five minor research grant this year. Linkage also developed with ICSSR that sanctioned a major research grant.

42. Action Taken Report on the AQAR of the previous year :

- a) The Principal released eligible teachers to attend Refresher Courses/Orientation Progamme or seminars.
- b) The college authority endorsed the engagement of the faculties in Major, Minor Research activities.
- c) The college management sanctioned adequate fund for the construction the additional building space.
- d) Fund was allocated for the purchase of books, journals and equipments.
- e) Guest teachers and casual Gr. D staff were retained in service to provide better service to the stake-holders.
- f) The WBSU was further requested to accord permission for running M. Com. Course.
- g) The authority allowed inter-disciplinary activities in the interest of the stake-holders.
- h) The college authority co-operated with the faculties in getting research grants from different authorities.

i) The college made repeated appeals to the WBSU for necessary permission to open M. Com. Course in the institution.

 The students' Union helped the students at the time of admission by running help-desk.
