1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the college:

R. B. C. Evening College is an undergraduate college that caters to the need of higher education for the students passing from Higher Secondary schools in Naihati and its neighboring locations. In a broader sense, it serves the requirement of higher education of a good number of students residing in the districts of North 24 parganas, Nadia, Hooghly of this state. The college provides graduation degree to eligible students in Arts, Commerce and Science following the norms and formalities of West Bengal State University to which the institution is affiliated at present. There is no doubt that the college has been playing a significant role in the economic and social development of the society where it is situated.

The human race is speedily pacing towards a "Knowledge Society" where empowerment depends on education and technology, and in order to sustain the development, continuous research and inculcation of knowledge is required. An educational institution is an integral part of the society and, therefore, community service is one of our prime mottos besides innovations in teaching-learning. Our infrastructural facilities are limited; however, efforts are always made to make an optimum use of them. In a society like ours, genuine progress is impossible if women's education lags behind the required grade. Hence it has been always our sincere effort to ensure the empowerment of women which is possible only through spreading education among them. Our teachers make constant efforts to arouse an awareness among the stake-holders regarding human rights, social values, culture and environment.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):

The college continued its efforts to secure permission from the affiliating university for opening P. G. course in Commerce. But the permission was not accorded to us during the year.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

The curriculum in all subjects is designed by the affiliating university. However, in transacting the curriculum, the departments used lecture method, practical classes (for concerned subjects), class tests, group discussions, special class etc.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started:

The inter-disciplinary programmes practiced by the college are:

- a) Teachers of English and Hindi Departments took classes in the Bengali Department to teach student relevant portions of the syllabus.
- b) Teachers of Economics department took classes of students belonging to the Commerce Dept. to cover up the relevant part of the syllabi.

The method and modality of examination is determined by the affiliating university which changes the syllabus and question-pattern from time to time. Before initiating any such change, the university usually held workshop inviting to it the college teachers of concerned subjects.

The Department of Economics organized a UGC-sponsored State level Seminar in November, 2013.

Ours being a U. G. college, there is no provision for students to get involved in research projects or programmes.

The college could generate internal resources from fees collected from students and interest accrued on bank deposits.

18. Community services:

The college NCC unit is a part of Bengal BN NCC, Kalyani Group (Dist. Nadia) and it carried on programmes like cleaning the locality, blood donation, maintaining law and order at the time of festivals. The NSS units, too, undertook the programme of cleaning the premises and surroundings. The students' union organized social and cultural functions in which the local people participated. The Annual sports of the college, too, was attended by the people of Naihati and its neighbouring places.

19. Teachers and officers newly recruited:

Twenty guest teachers were retained in service even after the expiry of their tenure in consideration of their experience and efficiency. Some Group D casual employees were also retained in service in view of their dedication and sincerity.

All the administrative works including those of admission and accounts are done through computers. The examination results and certificates are published by the affiliating university and the same are electronically processed, design and finished.

27. Increase in the infrastructural facilities:

Building space was increased and the amount spent for it was Rs. 59, 84,515/-. Library facilities, too, improved in view of the purchase of books, journals and magazines.

28. Technology up gradation:

Expenses for internet facility during the year was Rs. 30,376/-. Equipments of value Rs. 28,087/- were purchased. The college could secure LAN facility that connected the office, library and Evnet (college computers centre).

29. Computer and internet access and training to teachers, non-teaching staff and students:

Teachers and students have access to computers and internet in library and Evnet. Faculties, engaged in project works are benefited thus. Students of Commerce, Physics and Mathematics who have ICT-related course maters are provided training in computer.

30. Financial aid to students:

The college administration helped the SC/ST students in getting Govt. stipend. Besides this, poor and meritorious students were granted financial aid from the Student Aid Fund and Student Welfare Fund.

31. Activities and support from the Alumni Association:

The alumni Association conducted their Annual meeting and made valuable suggestions regarding improvement in teaching-learning, infrastructural development, maintenance of academic atmosphere and community service.

32. Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association:

Oral feedback was collected from the guardians when they met the faculties and the principal during the year.

33. Health services:

The college's Health Centre provided primary and first-aid treatment to the staff and students as and when needed.

34. Performance in sports activities :

The institution encouraged sports activities among the students. The Students' Union, a elected body of the students arranged for indoor games like chess, carom etc. in the common rooms of the students. They also organized the annual sports of the students in the playground of the college. It was attended by the teaching and non-teaching staff who acted as sports officials. The local people witnessed the programme as spectators.

35. Incentives to outstanding sportsperson:

In the annual sports ceremony, students occupying 1st, 2nd, and 3rd positions in different sports events were awarded prizes. Sportsmen having potential were advised to train themselves under the supervision of experts.
